Caro Trischler – Singer

Born July 3, 1995, in Karlsruhe, currently based in Mainz

Caro Trischler sings and performs on jazz stages across Germany. Her specialty is the subtle, quiet sound that effortlessly and confidently flows in both English and Portuguese. In 2020, she completed her studies in jazz vocals at the *Mainz School of Music*. She is active as a singer in various bands and formations, spanning genres from jazz to folk. In the summer of 2020, she released her debut album *North e Sul* in collaboration with jazz pianist Ulf Kleiner. Her second album, *When You Know You Know* will be released in May 2025. In October 2025, she received the Worms Jazz Award, which is endowed with €5,000.

Trischler's musical journey began at a young age, playing piano at home and teaching herself guitar, before taking formal voice lessons at the age of 12. She also started performing at that age. At 17, in 2013, she made it to the semifinals of the third season of *The Voice of Germany*. After the show, she toured through large stadiums across Germany.

While studying jazz vocals at the *Mainz School of Music*, she was introduced to jazz, soul, country, bluegrass, and Brazilian music. She developed a passion for Brazilian music by João Gilberto and Elis Regina, as well as discovering soul and classic country songs by Glen Campbell and Harry Nilsson.

Her musical path has been paved by several scholarships, including the Initiative for *Future scholarship of Rhineland-Palatinate (ZIRP)* in 2015 and *Yehudi Menuhin Live Music Now* in 2018. From 2018 to 2020, Caro Trischler was a member of the vocal ensemble of the *German Federal Jazz Orchestra (BuJazzO)*. In December 2019, she performed with jazz pianist and composer Sebastian Sternal, New York bassist Larry Grenadier, and Cologne drummer Jonas Burgwinkel. From 2024 to 2025, she is supported by the *Get Ready For Take Off* program by the *RAKETEREI* musician network.

On July 3, 2020, Caro Trischler released her first album, *North e Sul*, a musical journey blending soul, jazz, and country, from North to South America, all the way to Brazilian music. Together with producer and pianist Ulf Kleiner, she carefully selected and arranged a mix of their favorite songs, ranging from solo performances to full quartet arrangements. They recorded the album in 2019 at the *Summer Residence Studio* in Mainz. Two tracks on the album were recorded live at *Klangraum Studio*.

For her second album, Trischler and Kleiner teamed up once again, staying true to their unique blend of genres and signature sound. They wrote original compositions, most of them in English, with two songs in Portuguese. Over the course of two years, the album *When You Know You Know* was developed and released on May 2, 2025.

In addition to her own formation, the Caro Trischler Trio, Trischler is a singer in various other bands, such as the *Ali Neander Organ Quartet* (with the record *Jazz: Songs* released in October 2020), the band of drummer Julian Camargo (with the record *Songs About Being Young* released in April 2021), and the band of pianist Jan Felix May. In 2021 and 2022, she contributed to two albums by the band *DePhazz*. She has also been the vocalist for *Ramblin' Bird*, a project by guitarist Christoph Neuhaus (Landesjazzpreis Baden-Württemberg 2021). The vinyl album *The Underground Raconteur* was released in November 2023. She was also involved in Weeland's album *The Soul Provisions* (October 2024).
